Current Student Registration



Our current students who are returning to either threes or fours will receive their registration packets prior to the general public. This allows our current students preference in class placement. Students who will be attending our fours program have the option of all day pre-k (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) or traditional half day (9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Your child's teacher is the best person to advise you on the proper placement of your child.

I will also have opportunities for our parents of threes to visit the two different four year old programs.

Classroom visits:

*Please schedule a time that you would like to visit a four year old classroom with me.

The visit will consist of a brief overview of each program and a visit to the two classrooms. Our parent handbook contains a daily schedule for the

two classes for your reference. As always, please feel free to see me with any questions.

We are so blessed by the number of families that entrust us with all of their children! Siblings of our current and previous students receive their registration packets in January with our current students. This allows our current students

and siblings to receive priority in class preference before open registration to the general public. Please be aware that there is a significant sibling discount when two children within the same family are in our program in the same school year. Many of


our siblings are more than ready to attend STNS as they have been dropping off and picking up their siblings for quite some time!
